
- 1. The only Churches at present in communion with the Church of England are other Anglican Churches and certain foreign Churches.
- 2 Membership of the electoral roll is also open to members in good standing of a Church not in communion with the Church of England which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity where those members are also prepared to declare themselves to be members of the Church of England.
- 3. Every six years a new roll is prepared and those on the previous roll are informed so that they can re-apply. If you are not resident in the, parish but were on the roll as an habitual worshipper and have been prevented by sickness or absence or other essential reason from worshipping for the past six months you may write 'would' before 'have habitually attended' on the form and add 'but was prevented from doing so because' and then state the reason.
- 4. If you have any problems over this form. please approach the clergy or lay people responsible for the parish, who will be pleased to help you.
- 5. In this form 'parish' means ecclesiastical parish.

CHURCH ELECTORAL ROLL Application for membership

Renewal of the Church Electoral Roll takes place every six years. In years of renewal, no names are carried over from the old roll and everyone must make a new application to be included on the new roll. Please read the notes overleaf and if you wish to be counted as a member of your parish, please complete the form.

What it means to be a Church Member

This cannot be reduced to a set of rules, because there are bound to be diversities of individual calling to say nothing of our own blindness and sin - but within the corporate life of the one Body of Christ we can set down guidelines if we are to acknowledge the Church as a many-splendoured organism.

Within the life of the Body of Christ, Christians in general accept:

- * A commitment to belonging in love, unity and forgiveness to all other Christians, beginning with the members of their own local congregation.
- * A commitment to regular, corporate, renewing worship.
- * A commitment to learning the Christian faith so that there is deepening confidence in what they believe and why.
- * A commitment to putting Christian faith into action both in general and in the particular circumstances of their own life and work.
- * A commitment to service within the Church and in the wider community.
- * A commitment to take a responsible share in resourcing the Church and through regular and generous giving, support its work, understood in the widest sense.
- * A commitment to growth in holiness.

The Electoral Roll

This is the official membership list of the Church of England and anyone baptised and over the age of sixteen is entitled to be included if they live in the parish or attend the church. It gives the right to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting where the elections take place for the parochial church council and for the parish's representatives on the deanery synod.

Synodical government gives an opportunity for partnership between bishops, clergy, and laity in the life of the Church.
